Member Spotlight – Larry Gohl

Larry is one of our group's newer members. Larry was originally from the Midwest, born in Chicago. He lived in the Midwest until moving to Atlanta, Georgia in 2007 and then he moved to Peoria, Arizona in 2013 to be closer to the dramatic landscapes he had come to love. It was a decision to be close to family that brought

Larry to Michigan. He found out about our club by researching photo clubs that operated near Davison, the site of his future home once it is built. Larry started into photography in his late 40's looking for a hobby. He was a SCUBA diving instructor at the time and had become disillusioned with the attitudes of diving students and was beginning to lose interest until he decided to try underwater photography. He studied under famed underwater photographer, Cathy Church in Grand Cayman in the Cayman Islands in 2005 and became reconnected to the underwater world.

Cathy is a marine biologist, diver and underwater photographer and runs workshops in Grand Cayman and in the US. She has been teaching underwater photography for over 50 year and according to her website - She helps both amateur and professional photographers reach their goals to improve their technique, learn photography, and explore more through her personalized photo trips. Larry said in her workshop, they were taken out and were able to dive

and photograph all day, taking breaks to surface and don a new tank. It was immersive to say the least. Larry said she was a very good instructor, and he learned a lot and was impressed with her gallery of work. The workshop must have worked, rekindling the love for underwater and the creatures and the feeling of being in the ocean.

Larry produced 2 of his 4 eBooks – <u>The Clownfish of Indonesia Folio (The Folio Series Book 2)</u> and <u>The Whale Sharks of Cenderawasih Bay, Indonesia Folio (Folio Series Book 3)</u> based on his_experiences diving in Indonesia.





Larry has also been to the Galapagos Islands for underwater photography but unless you are an experienced diver, probably not recommended as there were very strong currents to contend with. Some of Larry's images of whale sharks and Gobi fish, we have been privileged to have seen in our club. Over the years, however, Larry said that diving takes a toll on you physically and he started to look for a new venue for his photography. He went to several workshops led by a French southwest landscape photographer, Alain Briot. https://www.alainbriot.com/Portfolios home.html Larry attended several workshops and fell in love with the Southwest enough to move there.



He produced 2 more eBooks centering on his Southwest landscape photography – <u>The Southwest Folio (The Folio Series Book 1)</u> and <u>The Darkness (The Folio Series Book 4)</u>.



Larry was also inspired by Colleen Miniuk, another southwest photographer and writer. I always hear how wonderful it is for advancing your craft as a photographer to attend these workshops and get small group or 1-on-1 attention. After listening to the reviews of both photographers that Larry had worked with, it made me realize to read reviews of the artist before signing up. Some are great photographers but not the best at working with people. Larry was clear he learned from both, but Cathy was the more instructive and personable. Something to think about before booking a workshop but both sounded like they led to some amazing experiences. Larry said moving to Michigan will pose new challenges and topics for his photography. He loves to learn and said that one of his joys of photography was learning new techniques, tools, and about the subjects he is photographing. He shoots Nikon; currently Nikon D800e, D850 and a mirrorless Nikon Z50 and processes them in Photoshop CC. I asked what he would like to see from the club and his answer was all about education – possibly he said, to learn how to shoot water drops or macro photography. I think that is a great feature of our club with our guest lectures and workshops so we can work as a group. Advice? Larry said: for beginners - don't be afraid to ask for help and listen to the more experienced – use every opportunity

to teach others. Thanks for a fun interview, Larry, and welcome to the Seven Ponds Photography Club.

SPPC Exploring Yellowstone by Germaine Finley – 6/2/2023

I had the privilege of being the guest speaker for the June meeting and went over travel and photography experiences from my travels to Yellowstone National Park. Stories were shared by others in the group that

have also traveled to the park and hopefully inspired a few to make the trip. It is a beautiful park, as most of our national parks are.

Yellowstone is not just the US's first national park but the world's first national park. It was established on March 1, 1872.

Below are some facts about Yellowstone that were shared:

- 3,472 square miles (8,991 km2)
- 96% in Wyoming, 3% in Montana, 1% in Idaho
- Highest Point: 11,358 feet (3,462 m; Eagle Peak)
- Lowest Point: 5,282 feet (1,610 m; Reese Creek)
- The park sits on top of an active volcano.
- One of the world's largest calderas at 45 x 30 miles (72 x 48 km)
- 1,000–3,000 earthquakes annually

- More than 10,000 hydrothermal features
- More than 500 active geysers (more than half the world's geysers)
- About 290 waterfalls
- Tallest waterfall near a road: Lower Falls of the Yellowstone River at 308 feet (94 m)

Yellowstone is immense and thankfully, most is left as wilderness. However, there is enough that has been developed enough for easy access so that everyone can enjoy the park regardless of mobility.



Of all the parks I have visited, the wildlife is more accustomed to human interaction and is very visible. Sometimes at too close a range. Many visitors make the mistake that because the wildlife is not moving away from them, they are not wild. This can be fatal. There are plenty of photo opportunities abiding by the rules - at least 100 yards (91 meters) from bears or wolves, and at least 25 yards (23 meters) from all other wildlife.

We were able to witness bison stampedes on the road, bison crossing the Yellowstone River, moose, coyotes, deer, white pelicans on the river and elk (everywhere).



Again, I hope members of the group were inspired to go out and visit Yellowstone or one of our national parks.

Our trip was sponsored by ROMEO BRUCE WASHINGTON PARKS AND REC.


A Big thank you to Jan Crawford for setting up the motor coach, our excellent driver and zoo tickets.



Bracketing is a technique of taking multiple photos of the same subject but with varying the camera settings. This can be, for example, changing the exposure in each shot – commonly, one at the recommended setting plus one over and one under. Bracketing can be used to help get the perfect exposure and to increase the dynamic range of a landscape photo.

Order 16" x 20" Prints for Competition from Jim Lewis

- 1. Price is \$16.00 each includes sales tax
- 2. You must size your image to 16" x 20" before uploading.
- 3. Prints need to be uploaded the Friday before our first meeting of the month.
- 4. Prints will be available for pick up on the first Friday of the month meeting.
- 5. Bring protection to transport your prints home.
- 6. Photos on this site will be deleted on the day of competition.



On June 28th, there was a board meeting of the Greater Detroit Camera Council where there were some discussions on revising the rules on competition regarding the use of Al. Whether you compete or not, it is interesting to see how Al is affecting the art world. While most of us use Photoshop or other editing tools

for sharpening, cloning out unwanted objects or adding in filter effects, capabilities now have expanded to the point where entire photographs can be created based on using keywords and no photographic effort at all from the" photographer". While, for personal use, everyone has the right to try out the full range of AI technology for what they want, the GDCCC is now taking a stance at how this will affect how we compete. The final vote will be in the fall and the rules updated but right now, the proposed changes are as follows (DRAFT):

Image Eligibility – Applicable to All Sections

- Entries must originate as photographs (imagecaptures of objects via light sensitivity) made by the entrant on photographic emulsion or acquired digitally, through the use of a digital sensor or scanner.
- Images generated in whole or in part through computer programs or apps that use key words to derive content are not eligible.
- Images that contain elements not originated by the maker under the capture definition above, such as clip art, skies or other elements from another program or source, and images that are rephotographed from another source rather than a direct capture, are not eligible.
- All editing and alteration of the source capture or captures in the case of composites, must be done by the maker and not a third party. This does not preclude the use of plug-ins or filters within a core editing program, such as Photoshop, so long as the maker is controlling the plug-in or filter and it is not generating content that does not exist in the source image.
- GDCCC reserves the right to view a RAW file of the source image if requested Furthermore, by virtue of submitting an entry, the entrant certifies that the work is his/her own and permits GDCCC to reproduce all or part of the entered images free of charge for publication and or display in media related to Competitions. This will include for example: presentation in the end of year Banquet Program should any of the images be selected for this Program; submission to the PSA Council Challenge should an image be selected for this purpose; and low resolution posting on an GDCCC website. The entrant further

understands that GDCCC assumes no liability for any misuse of copyright. The entrant further represents that to the best of his/her understanding the entry complies with all GDCCC requirements for entry.

Also proposed to be changed:

- Star trails allowed in CG. Currently under review
- Clipart is not allowed is proposed to be struck from both Color Print and Monochrome Print rules

Changes to the Print Classes and advancement in **yellow highlight**:

- There shall be five classes for competition in each print division:
 - "BEGINNER" is defined as a member who has not attained five (5) points in GDCCC competition.
 - "ADVANCED" is defined as one who has attained five (5) points in the GDCCC beginner class.
 - "SALON" is defined as one who has attained seven (7) points in the GDCCC advanced class.
 - "STAR" is defined as one who has attained seven
 (7) points in the GDCCC salon class.
 - "GALAXY" is defined as one who has attained fourteen (14) points in the GDCCC star class.
 - "GALAXY PLATIMUM" is defined as anyone who has obtained fourteen (14) points in the GDCCC GALAXY CLASS.
- Adding the following for Digital Color:
 - Images considered as Nature subjects (Birds, Wild Animals, and Insects) are not permitted and will be disqualified. Note: Landscapes and flower images, for example, might contain birds, wild animals or insects that are considered minor elements of the photo, are eligible for Color General.
- Digital Nature (removed the 1/3 frame exception contained in the Color General rule.)




Summer Photo



It's finally summer and below are some photo ideas:

- Seasonal Portraits. Take advantage of picnics and other gatherings.
- ➤ Hiking landscapes. Think beyond the beach. You can do summer storms, reflections in your favorite lake, climb a mountain ⓒ
- Summer sports kayaking, canoeing, wind surfers, sand volleyball. Take advantage of the long days and nice evening light.
- ➤ Food from barbeques to fancy meals to food markets. See what is new to capture and practice your compositions.
- Sunsets of course involving water but try a cityscape as well. Arrive an hour before sunset to capture the moment
- Long Exposures Waterfalls or waves are what we normally think of but you can try some street photography – cars or people.
- Dramatic light bright days create dark and well-defined shadows. Be creative on how to use that.
- Architecture while on vacation photograph your hotel or landmarks. Try different angles.
- Pets try panning shots with an ND filter and a slow shutter speed or freeze the action with burst mode. Remember it is hot for your pets but with long summer days, you can use the evening or early morning light.
