#### **Member Spotlight – Kristin Grudzien**



Kristin Grudzien is currently one of our clubs' 2 Print and Digital Directors and has been a long-time member (since 2012). She also gathers and presents our Focus Topic images and recently organized our July 1st Friday Game Night with her friend Shannon Hintz. Kristin had known about the 7 Ponds Nature Center from her teenage 4H club years but only found out about the photography club after she moved into the Metamora area and investigated some of the clubs offered at Seven Ponds Nature Center. At the time, Kristin was doing some photographing of Civil War reenactments and looked for a club nearby to join.

She met some very encouraging members like Dale Vronch, Hank Lewis (our previous and VERY long time Print & DPD Director), Jim and Bobbie Lewis, Stu Davis and more. There were also a few others at the time in the group that were not so encouraging and due to repetitive condescending and bullying remarks, almost made her quit photography completely. Fortunately for us, after her camera died and Jim Lewis stepped in and helped her, she stayed with the group and focused her efforts on learning technique and compositions. It sure

has paid off as Kristin (now shooting with her Sony). She has received many awards in our club, at the GDCC level and has had several images accepted into the Digital International Salon of Photography (PSA level).

The current leadership of Seven Ponds works hard to promote a positive learning experience for all members. Bring your cell phone, bridge camera, DSLR, mirrorless .... any level can pickup tips, enjoy group shoots, education and camaraderie. Kristin has won awards with both cell phone and DSLR images and has been seen multiple times reassuring newer members that the best camera is the one in your hand.

Photography is not the only passion for Kristin, however. If you know Kristin, you know she loves animals – especially dogs and horses, and both have been a huge part of her life from 11 to now. She started working at a Boarding Kennel when she was 15 and went to Macomb Community College to become a Veterinary Technician. She worked as a Vet Tech for 18 years and is now a Customer Engagement Representative selling veterinary supplies and equipment to vet hospitals, universities, and other large clients. She knows pretty much everything you need to know about horses and dogs from schooling and years of experience. She belonged to a horseless horse group that met at Lucy's Liveries and rode the school horses from age 11-18 and she bought her first horse at age 16.

Her first horse was Fancy, a Morgan that she rode for 18 years. She also got Vinny, a Gray, and has had him for 26 years. Vinny makes many appearances in Kistin's annual Christmas card and in our club presentations.

us Trivia questions. I think he gives us the toughest ones. Rosie (Texas Heeler) is Kristin's newest rescue and

is also following in Basil's footsteps of dance and parades, but she also has a talent for running really fast and competes regularly in Fast CAT – a Coursing Ability Test –



which is a timed 100-yard dash where dogs run one at a time, chasing a lure. If you have a dog and want to give your dog some great mental and physical activities check out All Dogs Can.

I do not know where Kristin gets the time or energy but she has been a supporter of the Rosie's and even became an official member in 2021 (see

more details on this group). This group in short honors the working women of World War II. There were approximately 5 million women that served in the defense industry and elsewhere in the commercial sector during World War II with the aim of freeing a man to fight. In addition to that around 350,000 American women served in uniform,

both at home and abroad, volunteering for the newly formed Women's Army Auxiliary Corps - later renamed the Women's Army Corps -- the Navy Women's Reserve, the Marine Corps Women's Reserve, the Coast Guard Women's Reserve, the Women Airforce Service Pilots, the Army Nurses Corps, and the Navy Nurse Corps. On October 14th, 2017, Jim Lewis was photographing the World Record photograph of the most people dressed as a Rosie in one place and she and Bobbie assisted where needed with the older Rosie's and equipment, dressed up as Rosie's and were part of that record breaking moment. Included in the event were 2 of the original Rosie's that were 100 & 101 years old.






Nature Center was very interesting. If you have not seen all the changes, I strongly recommend you check it out. I could see lots of fun compositions to

### SPPC Tips by Jim Lewis – 8/4/2023



Jim was the presenter at the First Friday meeting in August. He went over Raw vs JPEG and how to do some basic editing for light using Bridge, Photoshop and RAW. While there is always the argument for just shooting it perfect in camera, there are times that you may want to

adjust the white balance, darken or lighten parts of a scene to emphasize or deimphasize those part(s) or to better create the emotion you felt at the time the image was taken. This is going beyond the technical (which also needs to be good) and into the artistic realm. It was interesting to watch as Jim was able to bring out the detail in a bull riding image and also the process he went through to edit a portrait photo that he turned to black and white. Shooting in RAW gave you the most flexibility to make changes in post processing but for those that shoot in jpeg, some of the edits could be done on an image in that format as well. 



I read an interesting article on <u>Black and White</u> <u>Photography Tips and Techniques Explained</u>. From the article this simple tip stuck with me as it takes courage to fully commit to taking and thinking of a black and white image. I need to switch my camera to display black and white so I can train my brain.

"When you try to shoot for both black & white and color and then decide in editing which one you will use, your photos will be compromised.

Shooting for black and white requires a different attention and focus than shooting for color. Great black and white photography requires a photographer's eye to be looking for contrast, shadows, and the abstract. "
