# **Member Spotlight - Mike Mercier**

Many of you might not know that we have a celebrity in our 7 Ponds Photography Club. Mike Mercier has been highlighted by both National Geographic and the *New York Times* and also had a spot on Good Morning America. According to him though ... he has just been "very blessed" and "in the right place at the right time".

Mike started his photography career in the early 1970's and worked for a labor newspaper in public relations. Once, while working for the newspaper, they flew him out to a Great Lakes freighter to get photos and a story from the freighter and then picked him up from the freighter and flew him back. What a cool experience! He then got a job in a studio run by a neighbor. From there he worked with Joe Clark (HBSS -Hillbilly Snapshooter) who is famous for his B&W photography work he did for Jack Daniels advertisements. Again, what an opportunity! Listening to Mike is truly amazing to hear all the great photographic and life experiences he has had. Mike's first camera was a Nikon 35mm A1 (which still works). He has worked in the darkroom, done journalistic photography, advertisement, nature, wildlife, black & white, color, in both film and digital. He had some great mentors in Jay Drugmiller and George Najor photographing in the automobile industry for Lee Iacocca. He worked at The County Press for 19 years and has volunteered for 7 Ponds for many years as well.

Even after all these experiences, there was more to come.

Mike's celebrity status started on a vacation with his wife, Donna, to celebrate their 25<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary in the Florida Everglades. Mike just happened to be photographing wildlife when a struggle between an allegator and a Burmese Python broke out. Donna shouted for him to look, and Mike was able to quickly capture a series of images showing the struggle between the snake and the gator. The photo was sent to the New York Times by the Rangers at the National Park. The New York Times then printed the photo he took and story on the front page! (NY Times Archive - Feb 2004). National Geographic picked up on the story and even flew him back to the Everglades for a special that included his encounter. He was able to ride around the Everglades with head biologist Skip Snow during the making of the special but had to sit next to a 13 foot python in a pillowcase on one side and a 12 foot python in a wooden box on the other. OK, not the best seat on the boat but a great experience non the less.

When asked what his favorite genre of photography was, Mike said it was probably his time in the automobile industry. We are fortunate to have Mike as part of the club and have benefited from his many hours of volunteering both at the photo club and at the Nature Center.

Right now, Mike is fighting a rare form of cancer called Merkel-cell carcinoma. This is a rare and highly aggressive skin cancer. We are keeping Mike in our prayers and wishing him all success for his treatments. Thank you, Mike, for sharing these stories. You have so much to share.

- 5. Database to analyze and manage the book library


