About the cover photo

Congratulations to Tina Daniels for taking this beautiful shot of the **Polar Express** to earn a spot as the December cover image. Several members of the club went independently this year to shoot the 1225 Pere Marquette (also known as the **Polar Express**) which runs every weekend from Thanksgiving time to mid-December from Owosso to Ashley, Michigan. This year, it ran from Nov 18th – Dec 17th. It is a fun 4 ½ hour ride and tickets range in price. If you are thinking of going next year, book early as it fills up quickly. Check the Steam Railroading Institute website for dates & prices.

1225 Pere Marquette is owned by the Steam Railroading Institute. It is a class "N-1" 2-8-4 "Berkshire" type steam locomotive built in October 1941 for the Pere Marquette Railway by Lima Locomotive Works. No. 1225 is one of two surviving Pere Marquette 2-8-4 locomotives, the other being 1223, which was on display at the Tri-Cities Historical Society in Grand Haven, Michigan. The 1225 and 1223 locomotives are the only surviving Pere Marquette steam locomotives left in preservation. The No. 1225 was donated to Michigan State University in 1957 which is where the author of *The Polar Express*, Chris

Van Allsburg, first saw the locomotive as it sat on display next to Spartan Stadium. He later said that was his inspiration for the story, *The Polar Express*. Then 19 years later, in 2004, film director Robert Zemeckis led a team to create the feature-length film that we have all come to know and love.

'The Polar Express' was the first movie filmed entirely with motion capture. Sound crews were sent out to capture the sound of the actual No. 1225 locomotive and the locomotive's sounds and steam whistle were incorporated into the movie. Sounds from the Sierra Railway No. 3 were also used in the movie. More interesting info on the *Polar Express* book and movie.

SPPC Election, Pizza and Birds of Central Florida – 11-04-2023



GDCCC Sponsored "The Dollar Store Challenge" 12-13-2023

The theme of this webinar was you don't need to spend a fortune to get some creative shots. The presentation (The Dollar Store Challenge: Creativity on a Budget) was given by Canon Technical Specialist - Photographer, Heather Krut (Instagram). Hunts Photo and Video and GDCCC sponsored the event. Hunts rep Gary Farber (gfarber@huntsphoto.com) was online to answer questions and offer some discounts at the end.

Heather had some very interesting ideas from items found at the dollar store. She recommended using "fast glass" -1.8-2.8mm lenses due to many of the shots requiring lower lighting but said they did not have to be super expensive lenses. Also, use manual focus when shooting through gels or prisms as auto focus might not work as well.

She used items like: Clear or colored rulers, combs, reflective decorations, cheap tablecloths for backgrounds, prisms, chandelier pieces and graters. She said," Take the time to play, no rules". Not all shots will come out and that's ok. The worst that can happen is you stimulated your creativity.






Shooting something fast moving?

As an amateur photographer, I do understand the need to be faster at "getting the shot". Sometimes, my subject really isn't going to move around too much — flowers, waterfalls, a nice city, or seascape — but sometimes, I want to try something a little faster like a bird in motion or a train. The last subject was my most recent challenge this December while I and a few others in our club and other clubs all gathered on various weekends in November and December and tried our hand at photographing the Pere Marquette #1225 (the Polar Express). There are a few things to keep in mind and I took note of the following and it really helped in capturing the images.

#1 Use Continuous Shooting or Burst Mode

In **Continuous** mode, the camera takes photographs continuously while the shutter-release button is pressed all the way down. Set your camera to the highest frame rate. See your instruction manual but below are examples for Nikon and Canon:

#2a Freezing the moment

For dogs running or people on bicycles, the minimum setting would usually be 1/500th of a second. For faster modern trains or birds, 1/1000-1/2500th of a sec depending on the angle to the train/bird (straight on shooting can get by with the lower end of the range). For steam locomotives like the Pere Marquette, set

around 1/250th sec since the trains are limited to 25mph.

#2b Panning - Add Motion Blur

Try using 1/20th-1/30th of a second. Use an athletic stance with legs spread a bit and knees slightly bent. Grip the camera firmly with your right hand, extend the left hand as far as comfortable to support the lens, tuck your elbows into your body, and follow the bird/train with your body rather than your arms or head. Of course, you can also use a gimble head on your tripod if you have one but sometimes going tripod free when walking around is easier.

#3 Depth of field

f/5.6 or f/8 for more depth of field and a better chance of getting all the crucial parts in focus—the head, body, and forewing. Also set your camera to the highest frame rate.
