Special Member Highlight - Hank Lewis



I had the privilege to talk to Hank Lewis yesterday. Hank Lewis has been our Digital Print Manager for many years ... roughly since around 2011 or 2012 when he joined the 7 Ponds Photography Club. He had previously been a member of Motor City Camera Club and Avon Photography Club (which is no longer in

existence). Hank also served for several years in the 1980's on the GDCCC. We are glad he came to 7 Ponds and has shared his knowledge and expertise for all

these years. Thank-you, Hank!

Hank is a dentist but has pursued photography as a hobby for nearly 80 years. Photography was a lot different then, you didn't know right away if your shot worked or not, and you had very limited adjustments that could be



done with a lot of skill in the darkroom versus fairly easily with the use of post processing software of today. Hank said he really liked the old way of photography getting it right in the camera. Hank started with a Kodak

camera and then moved to a Wisner 4x5 Technical Field camera.

Of course, now he owns several DSLRs but his heart still stays with the old film cameras. He remembered when Kodak would give elaborate shows for photography clubs in movie houses. He also actually talked to Ansel Adams. Apparently, he bought a print from John Sexton (yes, he met him too!) and John gave Ansel Adam's phone number to Hank. John said he could call Ansel and he did to talk about the Zone System. Be sure to look the zone system up as it still applies to digital photography. In short - the Zone System was developed by the well-known photographers Ansel Adams and Fred Archer. Ansel Adams was known for his black and white landscape photographs and Fred Archer was a portrait photographer of Hollywood. The purpose of the Zone System is to determine a framework or more systematic approach for determining exposure and development (in film) that can be replicated and also that represents the scene as the photographer visualized. Although the Zone System was developed for black and white photography, and for film, it can also be used for color and digital photography as well. I asked Hank what his favorite trip was - he answered, Yosemite, Muir Woods and the High Sierras. Possibly inspired by his time spend out west when he was stationed there in the air force. All places I would love to go ... someday. Thanks again Hank for all you have done for 7 Ponds. Kristin Grudzein and myself will be taking over as joint DPD Managers and appreciate your offer to answer questions.

SPPC - Photograph Historic Octagon House, Rustic Barn, and grounds (gardens) July 17 & 18, 2021

There was a planned outing in July to the Octagon House. Not many went but those that did were able to see a really cool farm and lots of quilts. The Loren Andrus Octagon House, also known as Washington Octagon House, is an historic octagonal house located at 57500 Van Dyke Street just north of 26 Mile Road in Washington Township, Macomb County, Michigan. It was built in 1860 by David Stewart for his brother-in-law, Loren Andrus. The house was used as a "station" on the Underground Railway. It is now owned by the

Friends of the Loren Andrus Octagon House, Inc., which bought it in 1987. It was added to the National Register of Historic Places as the Washington Octagon House on September 3, 1971.

But his team was not needed because they couldn't let visitors tour inside of the plane so they elected not to go. This year they did a drive-in car show with parking spaces appropriately placed to comply with Covid-19 protocols. Admission was by vehicle not by individual which made it too expensive to go by myself and Dad didn't want to go this year. I found out that Jim and Bobbie were going and they very graciously let me join them. It was a very warm day, not as warm as the last couple of

weekends but close to it. It was nice to have the coolers close at hand have good company and conversation Dad usually puts a couple extra bottles of water in his cooler when he volunteers at the Privateer so I can just swing by say "hi" and grab a bottle; although I usually can't resist the temptation of an eight dollar shake-em up lemonade. They also did a Navy Heritage Flight (Corsair and Growler) and an Air Force Heritage flight (Mustang, A-10, F-35). The Thunderbirds flew in from Selfridge for the afternoon show. We got to see the Blue Angels and the Thunderbirds on the same day! Both shows also featured the B-25 bombers and the P-51 Mustangs that helped them reach their targets.



I had a great time and I learned a lot (Thank you Jim and Bobbie for letting me join you!) I got my first decent "cross-over" shots of the Blue Angels and the Thunderbirds... there is room for improvement... but



isn't that how always is with photography? I hope that next year brings more normalcy. If it does, Thunder Over Michigan is definitely an event to put on calendar!

Friday - Dressage tests - Drivers must memorize and drive a set pattern in an arena (outdoor at this venue).

Saturday - Cones Course - Drivers must navigate a course of pylons with balls on them. Knocking a ball off incurs penalty points (like knocking a rail down in show jumping).

Sunday - Marathon (cross country course) -- Drivers must navigate a cross country course with distance and obstacles (also known as hazards). The obstacles have a series of gates (usually posts with paper plates on them) that drivers have to navigate through as smoothly and quickly as possible to avoid time penalties and complete the course in the established allowable time. The plates are usually red and white. Red plates on the right side of the gates and white plates on the left. If the driver goes through a gate incorrectly (backwards, out of order, does not break the plane of the gate, etc.) they can be eliminated from competition.
