


A senior group from Romeo visited the Museum this morning. We sure had fun showing them the many displays and aircraft that tell the story of Selfridge Air National Guard Base. By their smiles and many interesting questions, we think that they had fun too. The Selfridge Military Air Museum is open on weekends from 11am-5pm from April through October. And is also available for private group tours on weekdays with reservations made at least a week in advance. Our thanks to the seniors who came out today! We hope that you will consider recommending the Selfridge Military Air Museum to friends, family, and other Senior Centers.

Located on Selfridge ANG Base in Macomb County, the Museum has interactive learning demonstrations, exhibits, and an amazing collection of aircraft and historical displays. Our outdoor Air Park is easily accessible and features over 30 aircraft. Groups are guided by volunteer docents who have extensive knowledge of the displays, artifacts, and aircraft.

A visit to the Stahls Automotive Foundation will take you back to a time in history when cars were more than just a way to take us from point A to point B. Gain a better understanding of how the automobile developed from a novelty to a main form of transportation. In addition to the beautiful cars, enjoy the <u>collection of gas pumps, road signs, oil</u> <u>cans</u> and other car-related accessories from the Depression era. Check out the <u>Events</u> tab for large groups and corporate event rental

Every one of our vintage cars and vehicles demonstrates special creativity and imagination in its engineering and design. Each car was chosen based on the engineering achievements that made it an important part of the evolution of the automobile. <u>Stahls' Automotive museum</u> features continually changing exhibitions or historically significant cars from the Depression and Art Deco eras, along with automobile memorabilia.

Street Photography

So what is Street Photography? According to the <u>The Ultimate Guide to Street Photography</u> street photography is about candidly photographing life and human nature. Most people think street photography must have people in it but that is not true. It can be taken in a city, in a park, festival... really any public place and it is usually a candid (non posed) photograph. Sometimes the person is asked permission before being photographed, sometimes after the photographer is noticed, sometimes not at all as it is allowed in public spaces. That opens so many opportunities for this genre. I will repeat - it can be taken anywhere, anytime.

You can be inspired by photographers like Dorothea



Lange (1895-1965), who photographed in America during the Great Depression. She photographed poor rural farmers and unemployed working classes. Her goal was to shine a light on instances of social injustice.

Or take inspiration from a more modern street photographer

<u>Allan Schaller</u> who specializes in black and white photography. He lives in London and his images are characterised by geometry, contrast, shadows, lights, a bit of surrealism, and humans.


